Rotary Youth leadership Awards (RYLA) is a programme for young people, which, was officially adopted by Rotary International in 1971. The objective of the camp RYLA project can be expressed by the 6Cs- Commitment, communication, character, competition, confidence, and courage. All of which are basic requirements for strong, imaginative, involved leadership. Their local Rotary Club selects candidates because they display leadership qualities. The RYLA week is designed to develop these qualities by providing an intensive and challenging programme, with all candidates taking the lead at some point during the week.

What does RYLA offer?

An intensive training programme for potential Leaders

A camp, which lasts 7 days, run by Rotarians and Professional Trainers

The opportunity to meet and work with others as a team

The opportunity to develop personal and inter-personal skills

A camp for young people age 15 to 18 years old

The RYLA programme includes:

- Daily speaker on leadership (9am to 10am)
- Daily physical activities (10am - 5pm) eg canoeing, hill walking, coasteering, windsurfing, mountain biking, rock climbing, gorge walking.
- The Abernethy Challenge
- Some competitions
- Evening events
